

INVITATION

GREAT PRAYER OF THANKSGIVING

- Pastor: Now in this season of Advent, God comes to be with you!
- All: God comes to be with you as well!
- Pastor: As we continue our journey to Bethlehem, let us open our hearts to God.
- All: For God will fill them with strength and courage for the journey.
- Pastor: Let us join our voices in singing praise to God.
- All: We will lift glad songs of joy to the One who is coming to us!

Pastor: At the beginning of time, God-of-the-first-moment, You tore open chaos, so creation might flow unimpeded: Stars and planets, animals, fish and birds

To populate this earth, and sing your praises,

Along with us, human beings, made in your image.

All these fresh and glorious wonders were crafted by you,

So we might live in your joy forever,

But we chose to despoil your creation

And live in self centered ways.

Time and again you sent prophets, women and men, Inspired by your Spirit, But we turned a deaf ear to them, refusing to notice you. So you came down to us in Jesus, your Child of abundant life, The sign of your grace, which never ends. So today, as we gather to mark this holy season, We sing your praises:

All: Holy, holy, holy are you God who comes to be with us. All creation gives thanks to you, always and forever. Glory to you in the highest! Blessed is the One who gathers us to you, Glory to you in the highest!

Pastor: In your holiness, you could have remained separate from us,
God of compassion and hope, But in your love, you came to us to be one of us in Jesus.
When we struggle in despair's poverty, he enriches us with your grace.
When we are weakened by fear, he strengthens us with your hope.
When we think our lives are empty of meaning, he fill us with everything we need.
When death thought it had lulled him to sleep, he kept alert, waiting for your resurrection love to gather him up and bring him new life.

Therefore, we proclaim that mystery which is our faith:

All: Christ died, giving his life as he called out to you. Christ has been raised up, resurrection love shining the way.

Christ is coming, to gather us from every time and place!

Words of Institution:

As the Pastor takes bread and breaks it, and as he holds the cup and blesses it, each of you are invited to do the same action: life the bread and break it, lift the cup and bless it.

Pastor: Let us remember what happened when Jesus gathered with friends for what would be his last meal. During the supper, Jesus took bread, gave thanks to God for God's abundant grace and provision for all our needs, blessed the bread and broke it....then he passed the bread around saying to the women and men sitting with him, this is like my body which will be broken for you and for the whole world, so that everyone can enjoy a new relationship with God based on love.

Later in that supper, Jesus took the cup and gave God thanks for God's goodness, then he blessed the cup and holding it aloft said, this is representative of my lifeblood, which is going to be sacrificed because of my love for you and my loyalty to God's purposes for all people. Drink this, all of you, and when you do, remember my teaching, my life example, and my dying hopes for you to live in God's love and grace with one another.

Prayer of Consecration:

Pastor: Remembering that we are your people, You pour out your Holy Spirit on us And the gifts prepared for this festive meal. You came down to earth in Jesus, And now we find you in the broken bread, Which gives us the strength To be your hope to those in sadness To be your light to those in shadows To be your justice to the oppressed. Your life was poured out for us in Jesus, And now we find your grace in the cup, Which gives us the spirit To be your healing to the broken To be your family to the lonely To be your love to those who are ignored. Amen.
