

Sing of God Made Manifest

UNISON OLD TESTAMENT READING Genesis 1:1-5

1 In the beginning when God created the heavens and the earth, ² the earth was a formless void and darkness covered the face of the deep, while a wind from God swept over the face of the waters. ³ Then God said, "Let there be light"; and there was light. ⁴ And God saw that the light was good; and God separated the light from the darkness. ⁵ God called the light Day, and the darkness he called Night. And there was evening and there was morning, the first day.

NEW TESTAMENT READING

Acts 19:1-7

19 While Apollos was in Corinth, Paul passed through the interior regions and came to Ephesus, where he found some disciples. ² He said to them, "Did you receive the Holy Spirit when you became believers?" They replied, "No, we have not even heard that there is a Holy Spirit." ³ Then he said, "Into what then were you baptized?" They answered, "Into John's baptism." ⁴ Paul said, "John baptized with the baptism of repentance, telling the people to believe in the one who was to come after him, that is, in Jesus." ⁵ On hearing this, they were baptized in the name of the Lord Jesus. ⁶ When Paul had laid his hands on them, the Holy Spirit came upon them, and they spoke in tongues and prophesied— ⁷ altogether there were about twelve of them.

GOSPEL READING

Mark 1:4-11

⁴ John the baptizer appeared in the wilderness, proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. ⁵ And people from the whole Judean countryside and all the people of Jerusalem were going out to him, and were baptized by him in the river Jordan, confessing their sins. ⁶ Now John was clothed with camel's hair, with a leather belt around his waist, and he ate locusts and wild honey. ⁷ He proclaimed, "The one who is more powerful than I is coming after me; I am not worthy to stoop down and untie the thong of his sandals. ⁸ I have baptized you with water; but he will baptize you with the Holy Spirit."

⁹ In those days Jesus came from Nazareth of Galilee and was baptized by John in the Jordan. ¹⁰ And just as he was coming up

out of the water, he saw the heavens torn apart and the Spirit descending like a dove on him. ¹¹ And a voice came from heaven, "You are my Son, the Beloved; with you I am well pleased."

INVITATION TO RENEW YOUR BAPTISMAL VOWS

For the time of the Invitation to Renew Baptismal Vows, you may want to have a bowl filled with a bit of water ready and by your side. It can be any bowl, but perhaps you have one that has meaning to it. The one I will use was made by a friend and is special for me. Sharing it with you for the Renewal of Baptismal Vows will make it even more special.

A Liturgy for Renewing One's Baptismal Vows

Pastor: Sisters and brothers in Christ, through the sacrament of baptism, God's Spirit has been poured out upon water, water sprinkled or poured over us or immersing us, water that flows freely for all who will receive it, water from the streams of God's grace, water that brings hope to all who thirst for justice and peace, water that refreshes life, nurtures growth and offers new beginnings.

Today we come to the waters, to renew in each other's presence our commitments to the Spirit who has birthed us, Jesus Christ who raised us up and our Divine Parent who declares us "beloved!" Let us show our gratitude to God by saying the Lord's Prayer (debts)

Our Father, Who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name.

Thy kingdom come, thy will be done on earth, as it is in heaven.

Give us this day our daily bread and forgive us our debts,
as we forgive our debtors. Lead us not into temptation
but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom
and the power and the glory forever. Amen.

Call to Re-Dedication

Pastor: You and I are the ones who step forth out of the safe waters of baptism, to bring hope, to share a word of love and reconciliation, to carry healing into the brokenness of the lives of those around us. Let us confess how we still struggle to follow in trust wherever Jesus Christ leads us. Join me now as we pray together:

All: Timeless God, You cast Light into sin's dark places and call us your Beloved Ones. Forgive us: when we still linger in the shadows; when we treat others in hurtful ways; when we speak ill of your friends.

As he knelt in the waters of the Jordan River, you proclaimed Jesus as your Child, pointing to him and his teaching as the way to your new life. Forgive us: when we put ourselves ahead of him; when we think he is no longer needed; when we fail to see him in the broken ones of our world.

Baptized and blessed in your living waters, you would have us be your followers in our time. Forgive us when we fail to welcome the stranger; when we refuse to forgive as we should; when we believe we are too good to kneel down and tie the shoes of the lost, the least, the last, the lonely.

All: Blessed by baptisms tears, called to service in the name of the Beloved, filled with the peace of the Spirit, we are indeed God's people—redeemed, restored, refreshed to love others. Thanks be to God!

Invitation to Remember and Renew Your Baptismal Vows

Pastor: At this time, please take your bowl of water and gently swirl your fingers in the water. As you do that, please think of God's creation of water - the feel of the raindrops as they touch your face, the beauty and mystery of the world's oceans, the life giving waters of the world's wells and reservoirs. With your fingers still in the water, please say with me, "Loving and Creator God, we ask you to bless this water." "Loving and Creator God, we ask you to bless this water." Now, you may make the sign of the cross on your hand or your forehead, and give thanks to God for life and love Let's pause for a few moments to share with God whatever is in our hearts and minds.
